2010 In Review

The year 2010 was the busiest yet in WASART's brief history. Our deployments and responses increased 100% from 2009 and the number of volunteers trained increased just as dramatically. We participated in retrieving dogs off cliffs and hillsides, pulling horses from bogs, swamps, and up steep terrain, transported abandoned horses to foster homes, and responded to enquiries about how best to deal with cows in rivers, deer in the road, dogs in culverts, and adventurous sheep loose from their pastures.
