

Core & Transport Training–February 12th & 13th, 2011

The annual Core training was held at the City of Snoqualmie Fire Department in Snoqualmie, WA on February 12th. Thirteen




attendees completed the training, three of whom were staff members of a large animal shelter. All segments of the Core training, except the hands-on demonstration portion of the Basic Fire Safety segment, were conducted in the



classroom. For the fire safety demonstration, the class moved outside to the parking lot where class members practiced using fire extinguishers to put out fires set in burn pans by volunteer firefighters from the Snoqualmie Fire Department. The Basic Fire Safety segment was taught in the classroom by City of Snoqualmie Battalion Chief and Training Officer, Todd Reynolds, and the Disaster Psychology course was taught by the ever popular Mary Schoenfeldt, Public Education Coordinator for the City of Everett Department of Emergency Management. Senior WASART members taught the remaining segments.

The next day, after completing the classroom segment of the Transport training in the Enumclaw Fire Department's Cumberland Fire Station, everyone adjourned to the North Parking Lot of the Enumclaw Expo Center for the hands-on segment.

Horse in the Drainage Ditch Rescue–January 18, 2011

When WASART Duty Officer, Greta Cook, received the call at 6:45 p.m. from the Enumclaw Fire Department that Buddy, a four year old gelding, was trapped in a 15' drainage ditch in two to three feet of water and mud, she was alarmed for the horse but pleased that the site was so close to her home. It was unknown how long he had been in the ditch but was eventually located by his owner at 4:30 p.m. After unsuccessfully trying to get him up the steep and slippery sides of the unfenced ditch, she contacted the Enumclaw Fire Department.

After notifying the WASART Call Coordinator, Gretchen McCallum, that deployment was necessary, Greta left for the site in Enumclaw, WA while Gretchen sent out an automated telephone message to Field Response trained members with advanced training in Technical Large Animal Rescue asking for volunteers. Ken Cottle, Heather Stewart, VMD, Ken Hasbargen and Lynn Henke quickly responded and were deployed. Ritz Duchesne in Olympia and **Bill Daugaard** in Kirkland were placed on stand-by.

Animal Control Officers Sergeant Steve Fuchser and Jenee Westberg from Regional Animal Services of King County were also on the scene.



Greta and Heather went down into the ditch and rigged Buddy with a four inch rescue strap while another boarder on the property held Buddy's lead rope. Several attempts were made to guide and pull Buddy up the bank but the wet rescue strap kept slipping and had to be repositioned several times. Buddy was also too exhausted and the bank was too steep and slippery; his front legs just buckled and he collapsed and would not move. After getting him to his feet, he was

blanketed and rubbed to be warmed up.

Buddy's condition was deteriorating quickly so it was decided to lift him up and out on the east side of the ditch. Greta and Heather rigged him with a 1.5" fire hose lift harness while a neighbor retrieved his large tractor. Greta shielded Buddy's eyes while a tarp was slid over the bank to help protect him from debris and brambles sticking out of the bank during the lift.

When the tractor arrived, Gretchen instructed the driver in how to lift the horse. Greta and Heather attached the rope to



Buddy while two other volunteers attached it to the tractor. The tractor lifted Buddy up and onto the pasture in one smooth motion. Buddy lay resting for a few minutes, then got to this feet. He was re-blanketed with a dry blanket and eagerly consumed some hay. Buddy was unsteady on his feet, so he was walked slowly back to the barn where he was put in a stall, the rigging removed, and he was towel dried and blanketed again. The vet arrived shortly after to check his condition. The rescue gear was loaded up, the mud washed off, and everyone departed the scene at 9:45 p.m.

The mud and water in the ditch, as well as the overhanging blackberry bushes on the ditch's bank, created a difficult rescue situation for this horse. However, the Field Response Team,

the Animal Control Officers, the property owner, the tractor owner



and driver, and the various onlookers all worked cooperatively and effectively in difficult conditions to affect a flawless rescue of a horse that could very well have drowned.

When Greta checked on Buddy's condition several days later, his owner, Shannon Cole, said he was recovering well and seemed none the worse for Greta & Heather Afterwards his ordeal.
