From the President

Many wonderful and adoptable dogs end up in shelters because of various adverse situations. Some dogs and puppies are strays or have been abandoned by their owners, others are relinquished because of their owners' financial difficulties, illnesses, or deaths, and yet others have been rescued from puppy mill raids and hoarding situations. Whatever the reason for being in the shelter, five out of ten dogs in shelters are destroyed because there is no one to adopt them. *Source: ASPCA Pet Statistics*.

Spaying and neutering will reduce the current pet overpopulation epidemic and greatly reduce the number of dogs and puppies in shelters. In six years, one unspayed female dog and her offspring can reproduce 67,000 dogs. *Source: Spay USA*.

So, if plans for adding a dog or puppy to your family are being discussed, don't forget the already available pets waiting anxiously for a new family in the local shelter. 
Sun and rain greeted the thirty seven WASART members who took part in the third annual WASART Shelter Exercise held Oct 8 and 9 at the Enumclaw Expo Center. The flood evacuation scenario again offered the opportunity to practice setting up a temporary emergency animal shelter.



The three operational periods rotated responders through different roles within the shelter as animals were brought through intake, placed in housing and later released to their owners. The Incident Command System incorporated by

WASART was tested as were the intake forms and communications. Safe animal handling practices were stressed and

safety of all involved during the exercise was the top priority. A special treat for participants was the milking of the small herd of dairy goats brought in by WASART Operations Leader, Cathy Reaney. This highlighted a very real scenario we may have to deal with in a shelter situation. Following the completion of the exercise, the two WASART trailers were

While not all of these calls resulted in actual deployments, the WASART Duty Officers were pleased to be in a position to have trained members ready to respond to these requests no matter the time or the location. WASART's current response number—425-681-5498—is staffed 24/7 by WASART's Operations and Team Leaders on a rotating weekly basis.
