From the President

As I sit down to write this column, the Taylor Bridge fire is still burning, only 40% contained, in Eastern Washington. WASART is still standing by waiting to be called to help. It's frustrating to know that we have 7 horse and stock trailers, a trailer full of corral panels, a supplies and equipment trailer, and 20 members who are experienced large animal handlers waiting to help, but not being called. We have contacted the Kittitas County Emergency Operations Center (EOC) to notify them of our availability, and left messages with the animal shelter at the Fairgrounds in Ellensburg. We know that the shelter has more help than it needs, so it's understandable that we haven't been called to assist there. But as we read the various media and Internet accounts of owners needing assistance to evacuate, load and transport their horses and livestock, we can't help but feel we're needed there.

Some may ask why we don't just load up, head over the mountains, and start helping. We don't operate that way. We only deploy when

our help is requested by government agencies or individual animal owners, or when we team with national animal welfare organizations like the ASPCA (American Society for the Prevention of Cruelty to Animals). There are "cowboy" animal rescue groups out there that do self-deploy and show up uninvited. When they do, they generally create more problems than they solve, and soon become unwelcome by the communities they intend to serve. WASART has never operated that way, nor will we in the future.

If we can't yet deploy, we can at least help support the folks who are on-site and know from their own experience what is needed. In discussions with several in-the-know folk, we've been told that the amount of in-kind donations have overwhelmed them and cash donations are what are needed. To donate to the American Red Cross on-line or by phone, visit www.bfredcross.org.

There is also a need for cash donations to help pay for hay and food for the livestock, to reimburse vets who are providing emergency care for all the animals in their own time, and other animal-related expenses that are piling up. I've learned that a fund to help out with these expenses has been set up at Central Valley Bank, 100 N. Main, Ellensburg WA 98926 through the 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, Friends of the Kittitas Fairgrounds Foundation. A notation should be made on the checks: Taylor Bridge Animal Rescue Fund. There is the possibility also that a PayPal account will shortly be established on the Foundation's Facebook page but that may take a few days.

Disasters seem to bring out the best in people and while WASART cannot be there, we applaud the energy and compassion of the many firefighters, volunteers, and emergency management staff who have given so freely of their hearts and time. We are with them in spirit if not in person.

Meeting with Ethiopian Delegation



On July 20, **Gretchen McCallum** and **Bill Daugaard** had the opportunity to participate in a very interesting and worthwhile event sponsored by the King County Office of Emergency Management (KCOEM). They were invited to join in an exchange of International Lessons Learned and Best Practices with a delegation of managers from the Ethiopian Disaster Risk Management Agency (essentially the Ethiopian equivalent of our FEMA) and a host of national and regional agencies and tribal representatives.

The exchange presented a scenario of a potential Cascadia Subduction Zone magnitude 9.0 earthquake and the damage it would cause to our region, based on an extensive FEMA analysis. The projected effects of such an event were truly sobering. The purpose of the exchange was to raise questions and share best practices about how to respond to such an event.

In addition to the delegation from Ethiopia, the participants included representatives from the US Forest Service, KCOEM, FEMA, representatives from the Muckleshoot and Snoqualmie Tribes, the Washington State Emergency Management Division, Seattle, Department of Emergency Management, international relief organizations, Microsoft's Emergency Information Management group, AmeriCorps, and Gretchen and Bill for WASART.

WASART was honored to have been invited to participate, and the opportunity to interact with a variety of other stakeholders in the exercise was very informative and useful. The Ethiopian delegation had valuable information to share, and all the participants found the exchange valuable and rewarding.


