WASART is the fortunate recipient of two sheltering trailers from AKC Reunite and local AKC chapters.

The generosity of local breed clubs and individuals has again resulted in an American Kennel Club (AKC) Pet Disaster Relief Trailer being donated to WASART in September, 2016 by <u>AKC</u> <u>Reunite</u>. This 16 foot trailer is fully stocked with supplies and equipment needed to set up an emergency animal shelter for animals displaced by a disaster. Safety Concerns Cancel Training



An unexpected storm during the Carlton Complex Fire's emergency sheltering presented challenges.

This year's Annual Exercise was cancelled due to safety concerns. The event was scheduled October 15, the same day as the worst of two storms with predicted winds up to 75 mph was expected to land. After much deliberation and consulting available resources, the Annual Exercise team made a decision weighted heavily by safety concerns.

It's a difficult decision to cancel an event that requires the amount of planning and logistics the Annual Event requires. Animal owners trusting us with their pets and livestock give up their weekends to allow us the opportunity to sharpen our skills. Volunteers spend months planning the event, including what activities will take place and getting all the right equipment ready and in place. The attendees travel to train with us, and then back home again. Some of them are hauling trailers and the forecast of high winds as well only adds to their risk.

As an organization that focuses in part on disaster preparation and relief, the cancellation was the only real option. Though the weather ended up being a non-issue, we feel a decision that reinforces our commitment to safety-first leadership was appropriate. Our volunteers and animal owners are important to us, and we are glad everyone made it through the weekend healthy and alive.

CERT Credentials Follow-up

We previously reported in <u>August's newsletter</u> about CERT's new credentialing as it relates to WASART. This is a follow-up to that original information. The Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) is designed to train citizen responders to prepare for and respond to emergencies in their community when professional responders are not available. Nine of the CERT teams of King County are implementing a new credentialing system for their first responders.

The Redmond CERT team recently announced their new credential levels. Like the Kirkland CERT, they follow the same three levels, with Level 1 being the most experienced and highly trained responders. The City of Redmond has determined that only CERTs at Level 1 or 2 will be deployed by the City. They do not self-deploy. Additionally, only Level 1 or 2 CERTs will have badges.

Similar to the new Kirkland regulations, Redmond requires additional training for their advanced CERTs. And once again, WASART membership is a substitute for some of the additional training requirements for Level 2 CERTs! While the number of hours and amount of training for eligibility are yet to be determined, it is an honor that the Eastside CERT leadership recognizes WASART training in this way.
